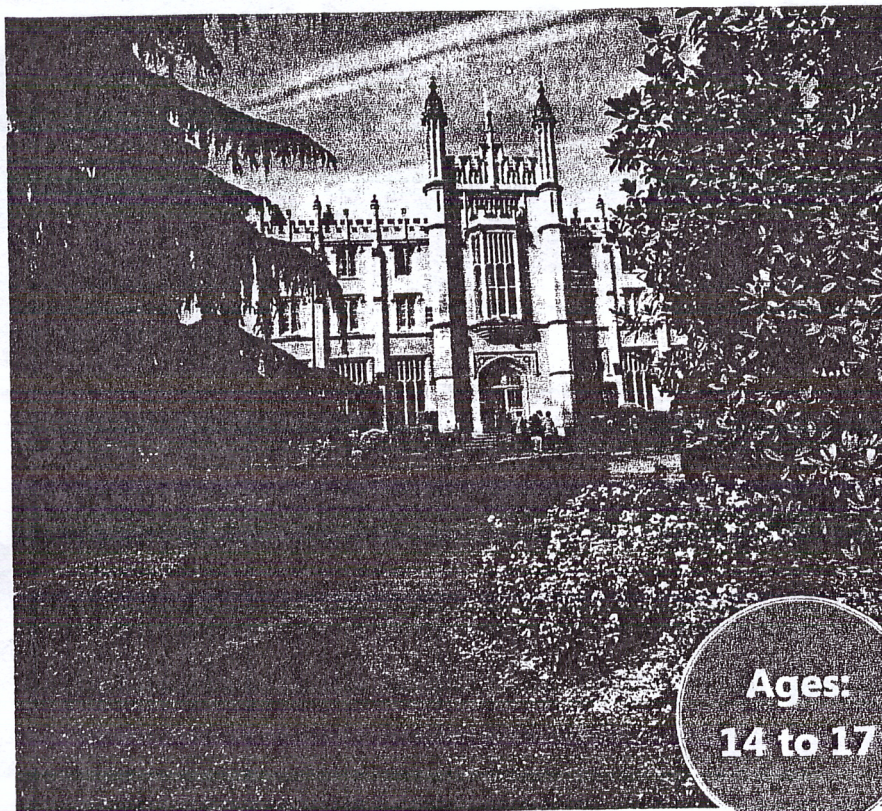

THE TOWN

Richmond-upon-Thames is considered by many people to be the most attractive area of London. It has been a popular place to live with royalty, the rich and the famous for hundreds of years. In and around Richmond are several very famous places including Hampton Court Palace, home of Henry VIII, the Royal Botanic Gardens at Kew, Wimbledon the home of tennis and Twickenham, the home of rugby.

THE UNIVERSITY

Richmond the American International University in London was established in 1843 and was originally an independent college.

Today it is an international university, which is accredited in both the US and the UK.

The impressive 19th century buildings are set in a beautiful, leafy campus of 5 acres on the top of Richmond Hill, with most of the school's facilities, including bedrooms, classrooms and dining halls, in one main building.

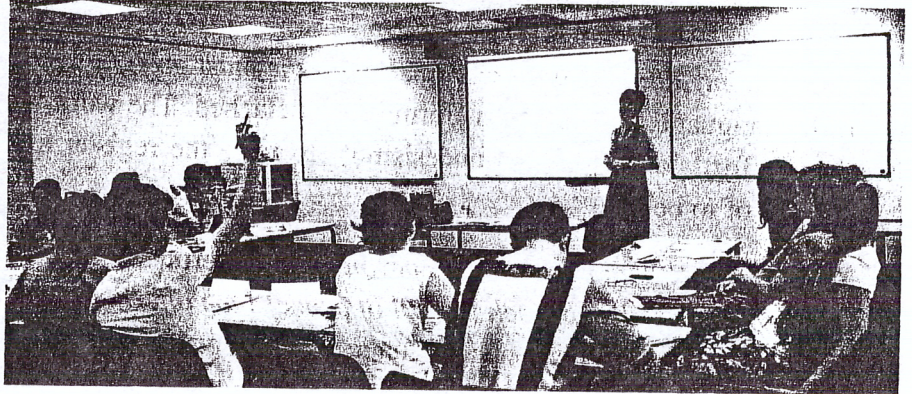
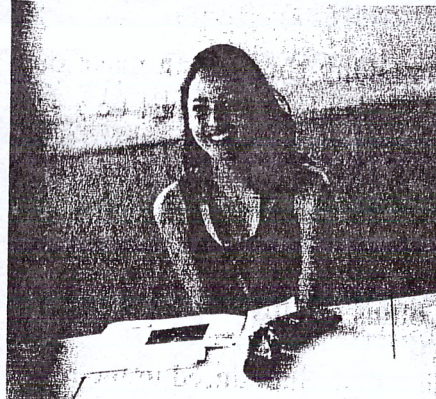
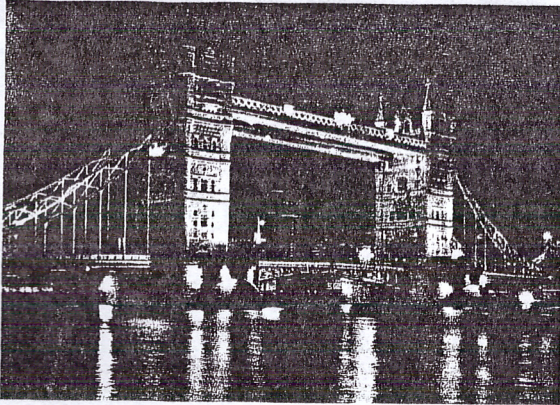

ACCOMMODATION AND MEALS

ACTIVITIES

EXCURSIONS

All students have two full-day excursions* and one half-day excursion each week

LONDON DISCOVERY THEMED ACTIVITIES

The Sir William summer camp runs popular London Discovery themed classes and activities, throughout the programme (see page 28).

These are designed to give you a real feel for life in one of the great cities of the world. English lessons add a flavour of the city to the classroom, while activity options help you make the most of your stay in the capital. You will see the famous sights and you will have the chance to visit areas of the city that tourists often miss.
